

Ask Sen. Hutchison to vote NO on tax funding for embryonic stem cell research. (Cornyn is correct!)

On June 20, 2007, pro-life President George W. Bush vetoed S. 5, a terrible bill that would have forced taxpayers to fund embryonic stem cell research that destroys human embryos.

The Senate is expected to attempt to override the president's veto very soon, likely during the week of July 9. That requires two-thirds of the Senate, or 67 votes.



U.S. Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison (R-Texas) voted YES on S. 5 on April 14, an anti-life vote.

It is extremely important that every pro-life citizen immediately ask Senator Hutchison to vote NO on S. 5 when it is brought up again.
